#### **NEWSLETTER FORMAT CHANGE**

In the past few months, we've had issues with the distribution of the newsletter. We created and sent the newsletter articles to Neighborhood News and they did create a newsletter for us, but for whatever reason the post office didn't send them out. We did receive a pdf copy of those newsletters from Neighborhood News, so if you'd like to go and read them, you can go to bphoa.info, click on 2025, then click on Newsletter and you can read all the newsletters for this year.

The cost of producing those newsletters has been borne primarily by the advertising in the newsletter. However, with the post office not delivering the last two newsletters, we have been paying for something that we're not getting. It's not the fault of Neighborhood News, it's the fault of the post office.

After some discussion, we on the Board decided to ask Neighborhood News how much it would cost for a completely digital pdf version of the newsletter that is devoid of advertising and filler articles. Neighborhood News quoted us a \$50 per page and based that on a four-page newsletter. We were paying \$310.49 every other month for the mailed copy of the newsletter. With this model, we will be paying \$50 per page. Most months, we don't have enough content for four pages but even if we did, it would cost us \$200 every other month. That would save the Association \$110.49 every other month for an annual savings of \$662.94. The benefit of this is we completely avoid the post office and their non-delivery. Neither Paul nor I are big fans of paying for something that we don't receive.

In addition to this, our property manager, Joe Gaines, told us at the last Board meeting that Goodwin & Co. will email blast anything that we want including a newsletter. So, the plan is to have Neighborhood News do the newsletter for us and then have a digital pdf copy that Goodwin & Co. will email blast to those who've subscribed to Town Square, Goodwin & Co.'s online presence. Of course, it'll also be available on bphoa.info.

The only downside to this new format is that those who are not subscribed to Town Square or who don't go to bphoa.info will not receive the newsletter. That is unfortunate, but easily remedied by either subscribing to Town Square or going to bphoa.info and either reading it in your browser or downloading it and reading at your leisure.

# Recipe Corner

## **GRILLED HATCH STUFFED PEPPERS**

Hatch chile season typically runs from early August through the end of September in San Antonio. However, depending on weather conditions, the harvest can sometimes start as early as mid-July or extend into October.

During this time, you can find fresh Hatch chiles at local grocery stores, which often host special events and promotions to celebrate the season.

#### **Ingredients:**

- 8 Fresh mild hatch pepper, sliced lengthwise & seeds removed
- 2 Seasoned boneless skinless chicken breasts for fajitas
- 16 oz Canned refried beans
- 1 cup Shredded Monterey jack with jalapenos cheese
- 12 oz Fresh salsa

#### Directions:

- Prepare grill & heat to 375°F. Spray grill with a non-stick cooking spray. Place peppers skin side down on grill, 2-3 minutes until skin is charred. Remove from grill; set aside.
- 2. Grill chicken breast until fully cooked, about 8 minutes
- While chicken is cooking, peel blackened skins off pepper halves and rinse under cold water; pat dry. Spread 2 tablespoons of refried beans on each pepper half and set aside.
- Chop chicken and combine with shredded cheese in a bowl. Stuff 8 pepper halves with 1/3 cup chicken-cheese mixture (press chicken mixture into pepper), top with matching pepper half and press together.
- Arrange stuffed peppers on a sheet of heavy-duty aluminum foil and place on grill. Cover grill and cook for 6-8 minutes, until cheese melts. Top with 2 tablespoons salsa and enjoy.
